 - o It is dangerous for us to have unrealistic and idealistic expectations of what Gospel community needs to be. Yes, we want to have certain qualities, but we can have unrealistic expectations. Sanctification, is a long process that we all endure with one another.

In community where the Word of God, prayer, confession, sin, fellowship, and various personalities are thrown into a blender, it will get messy. But it is good for us to be with others who are not like us. We see *more* of Christ when we are with diverse parts of His body.

COMMUNITY GROUP HOMEWORK

Before group starts, who can share the Memory Verse?

Read Acts 2.42-47. What stands out in this passage and from the sermon on Sunday or the past few Sundays?

Preaching the Gospel to Yourself

How has Gospel community and relationships helped you to see more of Christ and grow in your love for Him? What does God's design of a local church family show you about God's love and design for you?

Your Life Mission

God has prepared good works for you to walk in, but you can't walk in them alone. You are a part of a larger body of people put in your life to help you towards your goal of glorifying God. One way people help you in that is through prayer. What in your life could use prayer for to pursue the work of God in your life? Ask them to pray for relationships in your life that you are hoping to be able to share the Gospel with.

End the evening in a time of prayer, praying through the theme of the night using the P.R.A.Y. model with your group. Pray for these people you have mentioned and for your heart and plan as you pursue them in love.

Preaching the Gospel to Yourself (Matthew 6.9, 10)

o Always begin your time of prayer focusing on God's goodness, who He is, and what He has done for us. Pray truths from this week's text.

• Repent and Confess (Matthew 6.12)

o Real repentance begins where blame-shifting stops. Your circumstances don't need to change, your heart needs to change. Confess any particular sin that prevents you from walking out what God calls us to in the text, or any other particular sin you are wanting to fight. Ask Him to help you have strength to repent and run towards Him.


• Ask for Provision (Matthew 6.11-13)

o Ask God for new perspective and for the things that you need. Once our hearts are fixed on Him, we can ask Him to help us with our needs. When your heart is begin filled with the Gospel first, your asking will be far more in line with God's desires and will. Ask Him to work in the relationships in your life that you are hoping to share God's love with.

Yield with Thanksgiving (Matthew 6.10)

End your prayer by giving God thanks for His faithfulness and ask Him to help you trust and yield to His work and ways.
